# Zoe Weaver, QAPI Intern MSW program at Rutgers University



### Why did you choose to accept an internship at YCS?

After receiving my undergraduate degree in Psychology at Stockton University, I chose my internship at YCS because their goals and mission statement really aligned with my personal values. # Jamie Fox Chief Quality and Compliance Officer



In 2001, Jaime Fox graduated from Bryn Mawr College with a dual master's degree in Social Service and Law and Social Policy. Just two months later—on July 11—she launched her professional career as an LSW with the YCS Partial Care program in the Southern Region.

Her leadership skills quickly became apparent, and she was promoted to Clinical Case Manager followed by Program Director; overseeing the Vineland, Sicklerville, and Haddon Heights Psychiatric Community Homes.

While taking on this significant responsibility, Jaime discovered her true calling. "I am more introverted, and I naturally gravitated to the administrative side of the job. Organizing tasks, managing paperwork, and ensuring compliance are my strengths." Where others shy away from rules and regulations, Jaime thrives. She even kept her very first Human Resources Manual from 2001—and still has it 24 years later.

Her success as Program Director did not go unnoticed. In 2005, soon after YCS created the Program Integrity and Accountability Department (now known as Quality Assurance & Program Integrity—QAPI), Jaime was asked to join it. Jaime recalls her first major challenge: "Everyone was doing things differently; my first task was standardizing processes across the whole agency."

Since then, Jaime has accomplished a great deal. She has successfully guided YCS through five CARF accreditation surveys and has played a key role with her team in helping staff prevent and address licensing violations. "I take pride in being someone people can go to for help. If I don't have the answer, I can at least help figure out who does have it," she says.

Jaime's passion for YCS, our fellow employees, and the individuals we serve is inspiring. No matter what obstacles come her way, she is able to overcome them with poise and clarity. She is always level-headed and collaborative in exploring ways to improve the quality of care our participants receive. It has been an absolute joy to work with her so closely for the past 10 years. Jaime has been there for me on multiple occasions personally, too, and while I won't go into detail here, it means a great deal to me. More important than her work ethic, I would say it's her heart and genuine kindness that are even more worthy of this opportunity to be highlighted. 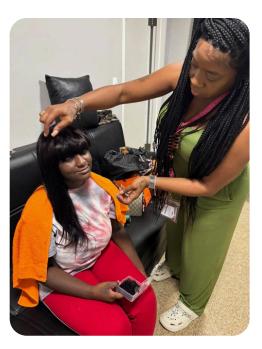

### **UKGs Enhanced Mobile App Experience**

### Hello everyone,

At the heart of our organization, we focus on our people. That means making decisions that support everyone at YCS now and in the future. We constantly strive to offer the tools and resources that enable us all to be successful.

As you know, we have already made great progress in using UKG for timekeeping and HR purposes and continue to enhance the mobile app experience. The eventual goal is for you to have full access to and control overyour own employment records, schedule, timecards, and pay here at YCS, including:

- 1. Hours worked
- 2. Locations worked
- 3. Pay statements
- 4. Accrual balances
- 5. Benefit information
- 6. Performance reviews, and more!

We're excited to announce that beginning January 2026 we're reintroducing the UKG Scheduling experience for all employees. The UKG Scheduling solution gives us one integrated location that is:

Easy to access – includes information when you need it, 24/7 via browser or mobile app Easy to use – includes alerts and automation for daily tasks, schedules, open shifts, Easy on the eyes – includes a modern look and feel with tiles, menus, and icons

In the coming weeks, look for more details via email and from the organization and your manager about fully adopting the UKG Scheduling solution. We'll also share information on available training content for you.

Until then, it's business as usual: Continue using the App to punch in and out, to enter Time Off Request tiles, to view your schedule in the system, and to enter availability requests!

Our goal as an organization is to make your job as easy as possible. Currently some of our programs are trying to do schedules twice: once outside of the system and once inside the system. By transitioning fully to the system for schedules, we will save you, our managers, the dedicated SRT employees, timekeeping support employees, payroll, and the organization as a whole time, resources, money, frustration, and process confusion.

### Key points from G&A Meeting September 18, 2025

### Finance Department

YCS audit and financials from last year are still being finalized, but early results show about a \$50,000 positive outcome across residential and treatment programs — essentially a break-even year. Everyone should be proud of all the hard work that you have done. We currently have 27 more residents than at this time last year — not including the new programs opened this year. That is a huge accomplishment. We are also on target with our budget for where we need to be in this new fiscal year.

**Petty cash:** To replenish petty cash, the proper procedure requires that the request is put in Oracle. You need to attach any receipts for anything you've spent on petty cash. Or, provide the list of participants you gave allowances to, and then we'll do a replenishment. A clear step-by-step request for petty cash process is being written up to assist and help answer questions.

**Please Note:** Accounting has a complete list of everyone who is responsible for petty cash. Please contact accounting if you have any questions.

**Note:** it is important that if you feel there are any discrepancies in any of the processes, you speak up so that we can look into the situation and ensure that all the processes are working correctly.

#### **Human Resources**

This year's employment engagement survey – called Great Place to Work – will be conducted through UKG. This company is a leader in measuring employee trust index, workplace culture, and employee experience. You can see Great Place to Work certifications on many companies' websites. This survey is used by 21,000 employers across the United States and measures employee sentiment in five different dimensions.

The survey will be rolled out on Monday, October 20th. Please begin to promote the survey. It is a great opportunity for our staff to share their feedback in a confidential way.

Employee goals for new fiscal year: Please make sure that all employees have goals for the new fiscal year. It is important that you meet with each employee, so they are aware of these goals.

HR will be sending out a spreadsheet listing the 25 employees whose reviews have not been fully acknowledged in UKG for the last fiscal year. It is important for the administrative process that every employee's goals for the 2025 fiscal year have been fully acknowledged.

**Note:** The Town Hall will be held on Thursday, October 16th. This will replace the monthly manager's meeting so it will be very convenient for all managers to attend. If you are planning to attend in-person, please be sure to submit at least one question that you may want to ask during the town hall at the time of registration. Mike Baguidy, VP of Training, will be this year's moderator.

#### **Training**

Lorenzo Brown has recently joined the training department team. He will also be replacing Laurie Levin, who has recently retired, as the director of the internship program. Lorenzo will do all the coordination of internships with the schools and the residential programs. He will also join the clinical rounds team. There will be one change in the on-boarding process of Interns. All the PSFs will be processed by the Program Director/administrator giving them more control over the staffing of their program. More information will be provided with the roll-out of the new process.

**Training Update:** Trainings are at a 57% completion rate across the agency for the first 3 months of the new fiscal year. The department has adopted a system to spread the required training out over the entire fiscal year so every month employees are responsible for two or three training courses. **Reminder Why Keeping Current is Important:** There has been an uptick in worker compensation claims. All employees will be better equipped to do their job effectively and safely if they complete their trainings.

**Keep in mind**; Medicaid auditors want to see that we've completed our trainings. It is part of our compliance.

**Did you know?** One employee's notes, documentation, and training records were so stellar and stood out above all the rest. When the leadership became aware of this, that person received a bonus. The hope is to be able to reward more employees in the future for similar performances.

### **Information Management Systems**

IMS will be rolling out a new PSF process for managers to utilize when bringing on new interns. It will be a very easy transition and will give managers more control over the on-boarding process.

**Scheduling System:** IMS team will also be rolling out a new scheduling system in UKG. The rollout will be implemented over the next 90 days so that everyone is sufficiently trained. It will become mandatory January 1, 2026.

All schedules will be required to be posted in advance in UKG. Open shifts will be picked up through the system as well. The new system will allow for greater accuracy in tracking employees' times and work locations and will be the system of record for YCS. Paper schedules will be eliminated.

**Trainings on Phone Apps:** IMS and the training department have teamed up to make sure that all employees will be fully prepared to access Scheduling on their phones through the UKG app.

**Note:** IMS has requested all managers to forward the email announcements about these changes directly to their employees. IMS will send out all notifications to the managers so they can share them with their employees.

**Treatment Plans:** October 1, 2025, IMS will be rolling out new treatment plans for youth residential services program managers. Clinicians in those programs have been trained and have access to the development system. If you have any questions, please reach out directly to ecrhelp@ycs.org.

### Practice Integration

There will be a change to the clinical care rounds schedule. This fiscal year, in-person rounds will be held quarterly at a centralized location. The goal is to have the first in-person rounds in November (date and location TBD).

These quarterly sessions will be mandatory for all DCF residential clinicians. However, all other clinicians are always welcome to attend. In October, anonymous questionnaires will be sent out to better understand the topics important for clinicians.

Please Note: Parent Child Relational Therapy, originally scheduled for 2025, will now be offered in 2026.

We're happy to announce that the internship participation in the clinical grounds training has been highly successful and it has contributed to interns returning to YCS as full-time employees!

#### **QAPI**

**Fire Drills:** Every drill must be entered into the ECR after completion. This includes all the accurate information as to the time the fire drill was conducted. QAPI carefully reviews all these reports, and it is important that they be accurate so that safety officers can receive their stipend.

**Medications:** Please check the expiration dates on all over the counter and prescription medications. Replace all medications that are expired.

**Note:** Keep your facility secure. Please keep the doors locked. Also keep exterior lights functioning so that the third shift can come onto the property safely.

**Physical Controls:** The agency is averaging about 20 physical controls per month. The documentation required after each physical control includes post physical control order, post physical control nursing assessment, post physical control participant, debriefing, and staff debriefing. It is critical that all these reports be completed.

QAPI will be sending out an email to all programs about a mandatory training regarding the documentation and completion of physical control reports. The meeting will be on September 30, 2025, at 1 PM.

Charting Life Course for Adult DD Participants: This is an annual assessment that includes the participation of a family member or guardian and/or a support coordinator. It is an opportunity to do a complete assessment of what the family and participant feel they need to improve their daily life as they go forward. Please put reports in the ECR by September 30th.

#### **Foundation and Allied Services**

Thanks to everyone for supporting the golf outing this year. The auction brought in \$23,000! A big part of this success was all the donated baskets by each program. The entire golf outing raised over \$220,000.
