GW School Halloween









When **Chinita Sanders** began working as an SRT in the Bright Start program, she noticed that some of the girls didn't always take pride in their personal appearance when going into the community. Chinita began bringing in her own supplies, turning her shifts into something the girls looked forward to. Before long, it became one of the most popular activities in the program whenever Chinita was on duty.
